

We would like to thank the Parsons Chamber of Commerce for sharing their offices with us during our renovation. When the building is complete, we would love to show it off! Stop by for a tour and a coffee or water and keep watch for an open house to be hosted hopefully before the end of 2022.

The Foundation would like to thank the building committee (Ned Wall, John Latzer, Jennifer Eichinger, and myself) for all the extra hours and effort they have put into ensuring this project comes to fruition.

Along with our new home, PACF has also welcomed a new executive director. The Board hired Becky Dantic in June. If you have not had the opportunity to meet her, please stop by the office and introduce yourself. Becky loves Parsons and is excited to help you or your organization fulfill any wishes to give back to the community.

Our Giving Tuesday match day event (always held on the Tuesday after Thanksgiving) was hosted again this year and brought in more donations than any previous year. The generosity and support of those in our community is truly amazing. Thank you!

I am incredibly pleased with the accomplishments of the Foundation in 2021. While COVID impacted some facets of our organization, we still made headway in executing our mission. 



Agency Funds

Local agencies may place funds with Parsons Area Community Foundation for growth and investment. Fund agreements state the purpose of the fund and whether the organization will have access to both income and principal, or only take distributions from earnings on the principal. A charitable gift annuity is a vehicle for planned giving. It involves a contract between a donor and the community foundation with the donor transferring cash or property to the foundation in exchange for a partial tax deduction and a lifetime stream of annual income. When the donor passes, the community foundation receives the balance of the gift.
